

[ALL STATIONS NEED TO FOLLOW SER PROCEDURES]



TACTICAL CALLS: "During disaster or other emergency situations, "tactical call signs" are very useful to identify a specific location or a function. ... A common mistake made in the use of Tactical Call Signs is giving the tactical call followed by the operator's call sign. ... [per] FCC Regulations, the amateur radio station must transmit its assigned call sign on its transmitting frequency at the end of each communication, and at least every 10 minutes during a communication. ... [BUT] In short: Amateur operators only need to identify with their FCC-assigned call sign at the end of a transmission when they do not expect to transmit again within ten minutes and at the end of their shift assignment. ..." (emphasis added) ..."... A TACTICAL CALL SIGN remains the same for a"... [specific location or a function]) "and does NOT change with the time, the shift, the day or with an operator change.
