

August 1, 2019: SER Nets Status Report – SITUATION REPORTS AND QWA PROCEDURE
[USED SER Q CODE REPORTING SYSTEM]

Tonight our NETS (NEIGHBORHOOD AND HAM) REPORTED FROM DERSCH/44 SECTION TO HAY FLAT.

WE HAD 24 (UPDATED) STATION REPORTS.

THE TOTAL NET TIME FROM START TO FINISH WAS APPROX **14 MINUTES** (THAT INCLUDES ACTIVATION, HAM NET AND NEIGHBORHOOD NETS THAT CHECKED IN).

IT IS VERY SIGNIFICANT THAT THIS PROCESS INCLUDED STATIONS GOING OUTSIDE AND PERFORMING A BREVITY FIRE WATCH PROCEDURE (QWA) TO DETERMINE IF THERE WAS ANY SUSPECT SMOKE OR FIRE. NEIGHBORHOOD NET RESULTS WERE THEN RELAYED TO HAM AREA COORDINATORS WHO THEN RELAYED INTO THE HAM NET. ALL THIS HAD TO BE ACCOMPLISHED SO THAT THE HAM NET CONTROL COULD THEN POST ALL OF THE REPORTS TO EACH OF THE SHINGLETOWN DIVISION SUMMARY REPORTS (5 DIVISIONS IN ALL).

RESULT:

1. ALL STATIONS REPORTED ALL OKAY - (I.E., ELECTRICITY WAS ON, TELEPHONES WORKING, CELL PHONES WORKING, INTERNET WORKING, THEY HAD THE ABILITY TO CALL 911 AND ALL OF THE OTHER ITEMS LISTED ON FORMAT TANGO 9A / TANGO 9M WERE OKAY) (I.E., **QXA**); **AND**

2. ALL NEIGHBORHOODS REPORTED THERE WAS NO SUSPECT FIRE OR SMOKE (HAVING PERFORMED THE ABBREVIATED FIRE WATCH PROCEDURE) (I.E., QWA).

THAT IS OVER 100 SQUARE MILES OF REPORTING DONE FOR ABOVE INFORMATION **IN UNDER 15 MINUTES!**

PLUS, THE PLAIN ENGLISH SUMMARY WAS PROVIDED BEFORE THE HAM NET WAS CLOSED FOR ALL OF THOSE LISTENING.

THANK YOU TO ALL WHO HELPED OUT! ORGANIZATION AND PROCEDURES DO MATTER.
